A celebration of heritage, history, and hometown fun called the Bowlby Bash is scheduled for July 14 from 10:00AM to 4:00PM in Enterprise, Oregon. Named for the historic buildings constructed of locally quarried Bowlby stone, the street fair includes tours of the picturesque Wallowa County Courthouse, featuring the famous stone and occupying a block of downtown Enterprise with a beautiful fountain, gazebo, and grounds. Walking tours of the historic high points at 11:00AM and 2:30PM with an archival photo display are also part of the second annual Bowlby Bash. Find out who Enoch Bowlby was; see the stone and the buildings still standing, handsome and sturdy in downtown Enterprise.

According to event organizer Marya Nowakowski, fifty vendors including local artists and crafters will display, sell, and demonstrate the creation of their wares. Food and information booths will occupy Main Street, which will be closed to vehicle traffic from the gazebo on the east end to Warde Park on the west end. Popular local fast food purveyor Sammy's BBQ and Alpenfest's German sausages are among the food choices this year.

Three local potters will sell their work or demonstrate their skill at the fair, and Russel Ford's Moonshine Glass is planning to set up a booth. The area granges have reserved vendor space and can be counted on to have homemade pies and desserts for sale.

Activities for children sponsored by local non-profit organization Building Healthy Families will include face painting, sidewalk chalk art, bubble wands, and other hands-on fun. More family fun is scheduled with a three on three basketball tournament and a homemade soapbox derby 'show and shine', race, and parade. The derby is a new addition to the street fair and promises to be an amazing melding of creativity and the "need for speed". All derby cars are gravity powered and will undergo safety inspections before the race. Inspections are scheduled on Tuesday, July 5 and on Friday, July 8 from 4:00 to 6:00PM. Entries will be taken up to the inspection time on July 5 at 4:00PM in the Enterprise High School shop parking lot on east Main Street.

A street fair wouldn't be any fun without live music and several bands will be performing through out the day. Wake Up Jane, a local pop-rock band will perform on stage at the gazebo at 10:00AM followed by Homemade Jam with their traditional folk tunes at 11:30AM. Music at the gazebo will resume at 3:00PM with Hannah Lund on piano. At the other end of town in Warde Park Natalie Zeigler from Joseph plays and sings her original tunes at 10:30AM and Janis Carper and Carolyn Lochert will follow her at 11:00 with their special combination of jazz and blues. Darrell Brann and Family start at 12:30PM then enjoy folk music by TR Ritchie at 1:00. Rodd Ambrosion's smooth folksy songs begin at 2:00PM and Brent Wydrinski will end the day's entertainment with guitar and vocals at 3:00PM.

Complete the Bowlby Bash experience with an early evening viewing of *Meek's Cutoff* at the OK Theater beginning at 4:00PM. The film debuted at the 2010 Toronto International Film Festival and is a compelling story of a group of Oregon Trail emigrants who have lost their way in the arid desert of eastern Oregon in 1845. The OK Theater, the only early movie theater in eastern Oregon still in use as it was originally intended, is a thriving part of Enterprise's cultural and historical scene.
